
#### CHECK IN

#### What is bias?

- A tendency to accept of reject a person, idea, or concept as a result of ones own cultural background.
- ▶ We all have bias

#### What is **culture**?

- Culture is also a way of describing the combination of the various groups to which one belongs—racial, ethnic, religious, and social, among others.
- ► To be part of a culture generally entails sharing a variety of customs, attitudes, practices, values, educational expectations, and ways of relating to others.
- Everybody is apart of a culture. Most people are apart of more than one.



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


