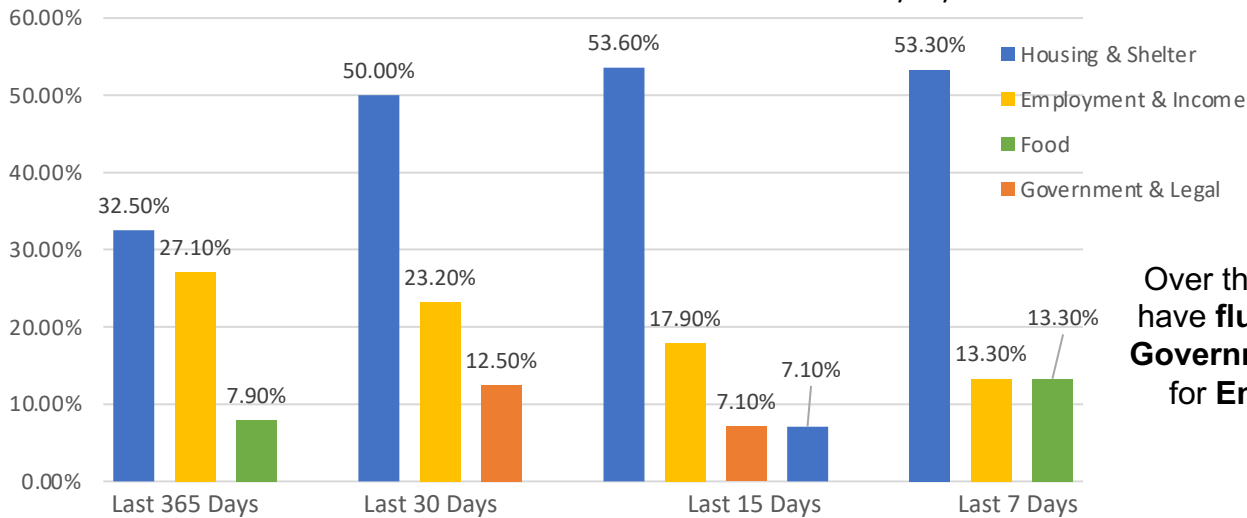


Emerging Needs in Williamson County

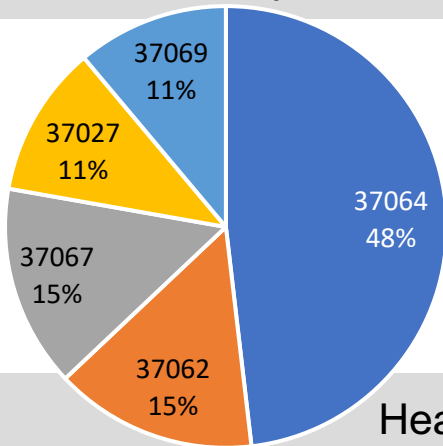

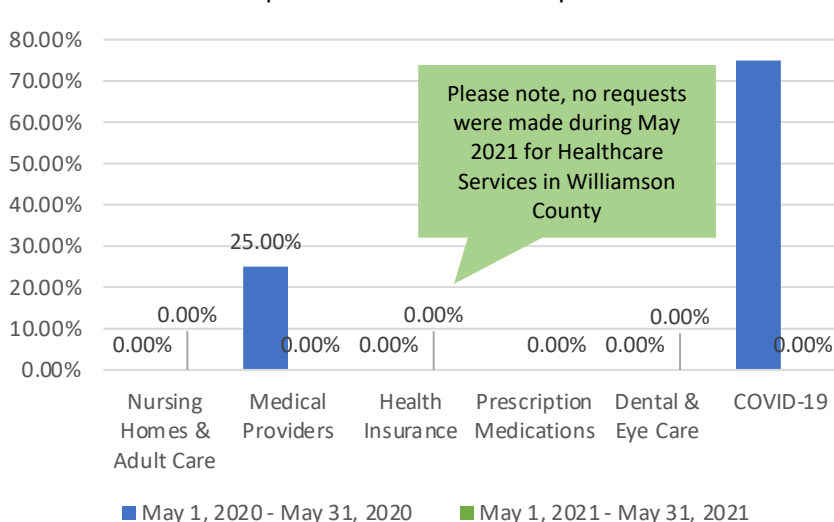

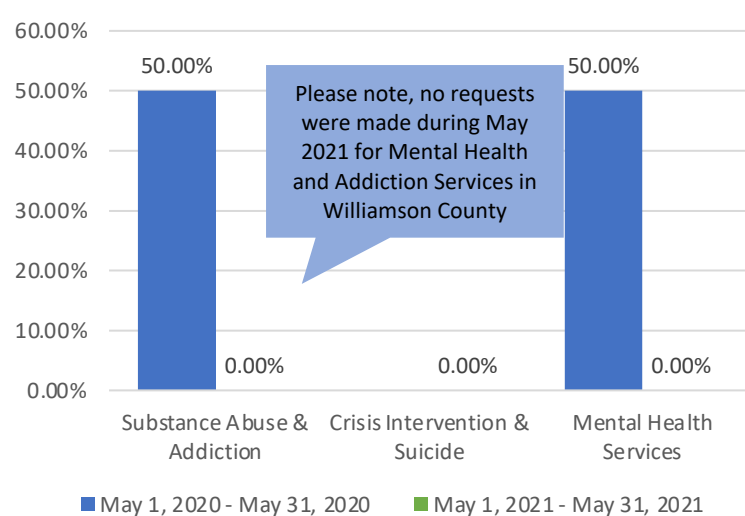

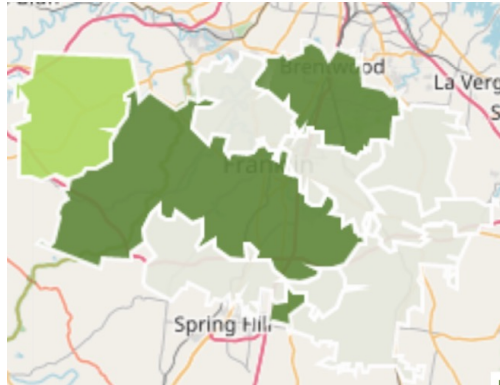

May 1st – May 31st, 2021



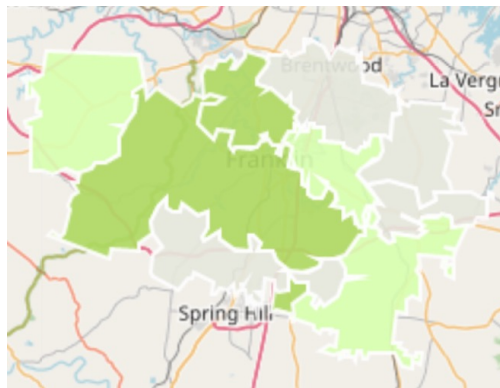

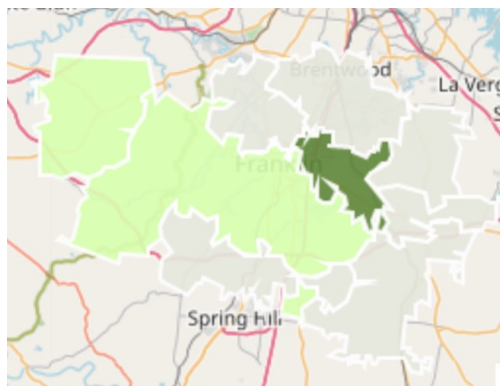

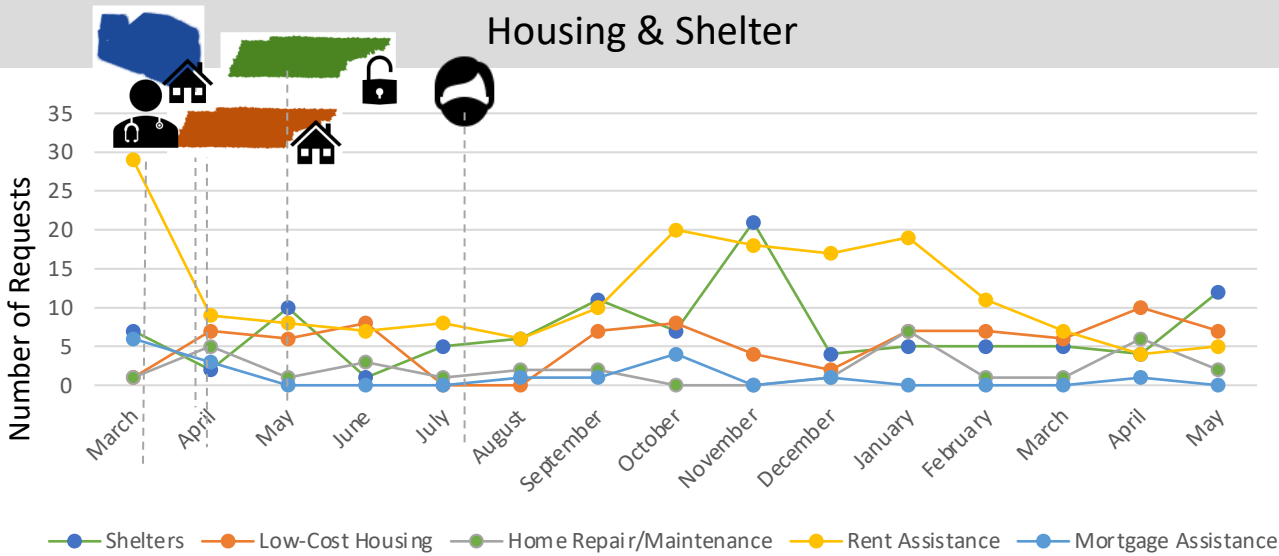

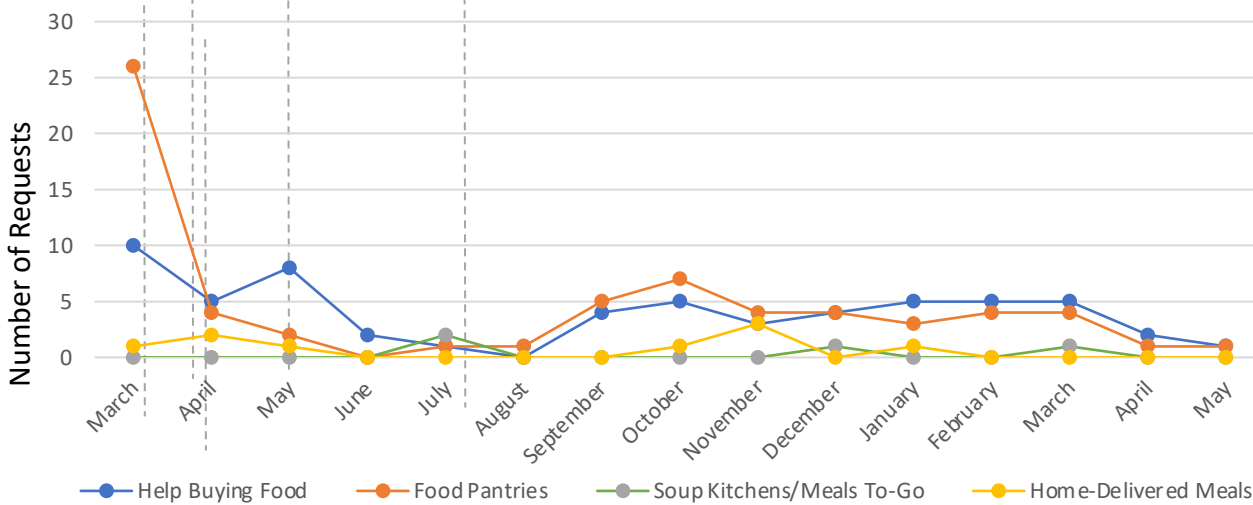
